2018 Year End Review

Village of Menands:

Having lived in Menands the majority of my life it has always held a special place in my heart. There are so many opportunities in our Village for both residents and businesses and word continues to spread. In a **2018 Niche Report**, **Menands** was ranked **#1** in best places to live in the **Albany** area, **#7** in **Upstate New York** and **#48 state-wide**. With unique services, a great workforce and a wonderful school district, these numbers are not surprising to me.

Condolences:

We were saddened by the news of the passing of former Village employee **Dan Moore** on **March 17**, **2018**. **Dan** retired from the **Water Department** in **1984**. He was a member of the **American Legion**, **Life Member** of the **Menands Fire Co.** and **Marshal** of the **Menands St. Patrick's Club** in **1965**.

December 4, 2018, family and friends said good-bye to life-long Village resident **Diane Brunelle**. **Diane** was a former **Menands Police Dispatcher**, became a full-time active member of the **Menands Fire Co.** in **2006** and later served as **Menands Fire Police Lieutenant**. **Diane** was past **Secretary** of the **Menands Fire Company** and **Treasurer** of the **Menands Fire Co. Auxiliary**. She was also an **Honorary Marshal** of the **Menands St. Patrick's Club**.

Public Safety:

The Village of Menands is very fortunate to maintain our own Dept. of Public Works, Police and Fire Depts. During my time as Mayor, I have relied heavily on the experience and hard work of our departments. The members of all of these departments have a unique working relationship and work very well together. They do not hesitate to offer their services to each other to ensure our safety. While the members of our public safety departments consider what they do as just part of their job, their dedication to our community is commendable and very much appreciated.

In February, 2018, the potential for local flooding became an issue, with particular concern in Menands at Village One Apartments. An emergency meeting was held where I joined Town Supervisor, Paula Mahan, Colonie Police Dept., Town Fire Coordinator, Albany County Sheriff's Dept., NYS Homeland Security, American Red Cross, and Village officials and department heads, to establish an emergency evacuation plan should it become necessary. A coordinated effort to notify the residents of Village One became a priority, with a letter and flyer regarding evacuations delivered by Town and Village PD and FD. Our DPW picked up sandbags from Albany County and delivered them to Village One Apartments. Clerk Handerhan coordinated with NYS for an Aqua Dam to be put in place if needed. Thankfully we were spared the flooding but relieved to have had plans in place to ensure the safety of the residents.

To further the effort to educate the residents of Village One Apts., should an evacuation become necessary in the future, as it had in 2008, a "Meet and Greet" was organized and held in July near the main office at Village One Apts. Members of the Albany County Sheriff's Dept., Colonie EMS, Menands FD and PD, Town of Colonie PD, Schuyler Heights FD, American Red Cross, and Village and Town officials gathered to share information with the residents and provide emergency backpacks and other items to assist in an evacuation. Having these outside agencies working closely with our own public safety departments, is reassuring and very much appreciated.

Dept. of Public Works: (DPW)

In addition to the numerous services performed regularly for the residents, such as trash, recycling, leaf pick-up, salting, snow removal, etc., the **DPW** had another busy year with other projects:

- Repairing water main breaks as quickly as possible to ensure minimal disruption of service to the residents and businesses.
- Attend various training classes to enhance skills and knowledge.
- Continued maintenance of DPW equipment, buildings and property.
- Replaced water valves to expedite necessary shut downs.
- Maintenance of storm drains and trash racks.
- Assisted engineers with infrastructure projects.
- Responded to resident concerns of various issues, including grinder pump replacements.
- Assisted in site plan review applications for new building projects.
- Hanging baskets and banners along Broadway, as well as other holiday decorations around the Village.
- Field prep and maintenance of parks, including lawn grading and topsoil in the grove area of Ganser-Smith Park.
- Meter readings.
- New gate at Glenwood Road.

Menands Police Dept.: (MPD)

Menands Police Dept. provides **24/7** coverage for the **Village of Menands**. They respond to all calls for service including EMS and fire. The **Police Dept**. is actively involved in all community activities including, but not limited to, **Menands School**, **Youth** and **Senior Citizen** events.

- Chief Michael O'Brien retired in September, 2018 and we thank him for his years of service to the Village and MPD.
- Sept. 5th Detective Sgt. Frank Lacosse was sworn in as the new Chief of the Menands Police Dept.
- Sgt Ryan St. Gelais was promoted to Detective Sgt. and sworn in by Chief Lacosse, also on September 5th.
- Chief Lacosse was the guest speaker at the Village Fall Business Breakfast, sharing his
 vision for the future of the MPD and their involvement in the community. He also spoke at a
 Senior luncheon, sharing information on scams and things they should be cautious of.
- **Chief Lacosse** has also developed a close working relationship with **Menands School**. He sees the department becoming more involved with the seniors and the year-round programs and events for the youth.
- Two new members of the force were welcomed in 2018:
 - Officer Tim Hajec, came from the Schenectady County Sheriff's Department. Tim
 has been recognized for his work in traffic safety and DWI enforcement. Since joining
 the MPD in July, he has made numerous DWI arrests.
 - Officer Kevin Schwebke came from Ravena Coeymans Police Dept. and comes with a background as a School Resource Officer. Kevin also has attended several training schools in areas including investigative and traffic enforcement. He also has been effective in arresting DWI offenders since joining MPD.
- Officer Mike D'Ambro was promoted to Sgt. in October.
- The MPD, along with the PBA, attended the Menands School PTA safety forum at school and Officers gave out bike safety equipment and also presented information on the new bike registration program in Menands.
- Officers follow the school buses to ensure that the students can get on board the buses and
 arrive to school safely. The Officers issued several tickets for motorist that passed the buses
 while they were stopped with their signs out and their flashers on. After following the buses, an
 Officer goes to the school and greets the children to let them interact with the police in a
 positive way.
- The **MPD** performed safety checks at local businesses, upon request, to ensure a proper safety plan was in place along with safety measures for the property and employees.
- MPD recognized UPS delivery driver, John Creech, at the Town of Colonie Law Day Breakfast, for his service as a Neighborhood Watch member in Menands. Having serviced the Village for 20 years, John is familiar with the neighborhoods and has reported to the MPD when something is off. John's diligence has assisted the MPD in making arrests, recovering stolen property and closing investigations. John is a perfect example of "If you see something, say something".
- Assisted in site plan review applications for new building projects.
- Officer PJ Stone became President of the Menands PBA and Officer John Murphy, Vice President. The PBA contributes towards many events and charities throughout the year.
- Police patrol at various events, such as Concerts in the Park and Village Picnic.
- New in 2018, the MPD created their own Facebook page, under Menands Police
 Department to keep residents informed of emergencies and public safety announcements.

Village Court:

- Menands Village Court, by volume, is one of the largest Town and Village Courts in Albany County, in part to our geographic location, particularly along 1787.
- In 2018, the Village Court heard 3,222 cases. These include 2,941 traffic cases (including 114 DWI cases), 255 penal cases and 26 civil cases.
- Court was held five times per month, not including hearings, arraignments or trials. On traffic court nights, upwards of **300** cases can be heard.
- Village Justice, Chris Flint and Acting Village Justice, Robert Becher attended mandatory Judges School and Court Clerks Susan and Kim also attended training sessions, staying up to date on policies and procedures in the Unified Court System.
- Welcomed **Deputy Court Clerk**, **Danielle Murphy**, replacing Kim.
- The Court received **\$4,694.95** in **JCAP** funding which was used to purchase security equipment.

Building Dept.:

- 63 building permits were issued.
- **Code Enforcement** worked closely with developers on building projects in **Menands** to ensure all requirements were met and expedite projects.
- Paul and Lyle attended the NYSBOC training conference to maintain their required annual training.
- Paul attended the monthly sessions with the **Stormwater Coalition** as our **MS4 Officer** and the **CDTC Planning Committee** meetings on behalf of the Village.
- Available to assist homeowners, businesses and developers with projects to ensure safety and code compliance.

Village Initiatives:

- New windows installed at Village Office.
- Passed a Local Law amending Village code on abandoned street signs and graffiti.
- Purchased ChromeBooks, initiated by Trustee Harris, for Village officials, to reduce paper and costs, and improve efficiency.
- Following a two year process working with CP Rail for a Quiet Zone in Menands, our application was recently approved. This will eliminate train horns between the hours of 10 pm and 7 am, while passing through the Village. There are upgrades that need to be made at the four crossings in Menands prior to implementation, which will begin later this year.
- Continued participation in Albany County's Emergency Managers Program and Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- Working with Albany County Municipal Leaders on Shared Services and other agendas.
- I coordinated with Albany County to cover Village streets should they need plowing while
 our trucks were equipped with the leaf machine. I am grateful to County Executive Dan
 McCoy for his partnership and support of Menands.

Grant Opportunities:

We continue to explore grant opportunities to help defray costs of projects. Some have been successful, while others have not, but we will continue to look at future applications.

- NYS Archives Grant
 - \$15,000 awarded to consolidate records and improve records retention.
- NYS Department of Health/NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation Water Infrastructure Improvement Act

The project submitted for the Water Infrastructure Improvement Act was the replacement of the water distribution piping on Hendrick Avenue, Highland Street, Hampton Street, Pawling Street and Kingston Street. The program funds 60% of project costs in the form of grants. The Village was not successful in the 2018 round and will be re-submitting in 2019.

- NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation Green Infrastructure Grant Program
 - The project submitted for the Green Infrastructure Grant Program was for improvements to the site of the Village Office at 280 Broadway. The program funds 90% of project costs in the form of grants. The Village was not successful in the 2018 round and will be re-submitting in 2019.
- CDTC Community and Transportation Linkage Program
 - The project submitted for the CTDC Linkage Program was for a comprehensive update of the Village's land use regulations including zoning, subdivision, complete streets policy, and design guidelines. The Village was not successful in the 2018 round and will be re-submitting in 2019.

- Leak detection performed to identify water losses within Village
- Sewer Lines cleaned
- Storm drainage improvements on Glenwood Road
- Tree Inventory throughout Village

Paving:

Continued paving, with the following streets paved in 2018:

- Glenwood Road (including storm drain repair)
- Pawling Street
- Kingston Street

With a yearly paving program, we have completed paving a majority of the Village streets and will continue with the program over the next few years to complete the process. Thereafter, we will establish a paving plan to keep our streets in good condition.

Economic Development:

The Village of Menands has taken a very proactive approach to encourage economic development in Menands. Our efforts have led to over \$50 million in new commercial investment along the Broadway Corridor in the last few years, with several new projects pending for 2019. Being centrally located in the Capital District, we are seeing new projects, including businesses locating their facilities in Menands, redevelopment of parcels and existing businesses doing upgrades and improvements to their current locations. As part of our business friendly atmosphere, our departments work closely with developers to assist them with the Site Plan Review Process to expedite projects and make sure all requirements are met. Some business highlights from 2018 include:

- In July, Moody's Annual Issuer Comment Report was issued for Menands. Our credit overview noted Menands credit position is high quality, and has an Aa3 rating. The key credit factors include a very strong financial position, an affordable debt burden and midranged pension liability. The credit position also reflects a strong wealth and income profile and a narrow tax base.
- United Ordained Ministry Church of Christ, 281 Broadway: This project resulted in the complete rehabilitation of a vacant commercial building on Broadway. The Village worked with the owners to ensure that all building code and fire safety regulations were complied with.
- 311 Broadway: This building was purchased from the Albany County Land Bank and has been put back on the tax rolls after a substantial rehabilitation.
- Kasselman Electric, 279 Broadway: This building will be the new headquarters of Kasselman Solar and will provide warehouse and office space for the company.
- **U-Haul, 125 Broadway:** Work continues, at the former **Williams Press** building, to substantially remodel the building to accommodate vehicle storage, retail and vehicle leasing.
- Nfranstructure, 431C Broadway: All rehabilitation has been completed in the former Grand Union/ Two Guys building. The space is now fully occupied.
- Business Breakfast is held twice a year. This presents an opportunity for the Village to update the businesses on happenings in Menands and for the businesses to share thoughts and ideas with the Village. May, 2018, the UAlbany Graduate Planning Studio students presented their findings of the research performed in the Village to incorporate into a Comprehensive Plan in 2019. In October, Chief Frank Lacosse spoke to the attendees about his vision for the future of the MPD and safeguards that are in place to protect businesses and residents in the Village.
- The Finishing Trades Institute of New York, located at 191 Broadway, held their Apprenticeship Graduation Ceremony on August 18, 2018. We are proud to have the Finishing Trades Institute located in Menands and congratulate the graduates.

Future development:

- The Workers Comp. building at 100 Broadway, recently sold for \$3.7 million. The building
 will be renovated and used for commercial office space. On behalf of the Village, I sent a letter
 of support for the developer seeking assistance through the Brownfield Redevelopment
 Assistance Program.
- Riverview Assets, LLC, who purchased Mid-City Shopping Center, has begun renovations of the property and continues to seek tenants to fill the empty spaces.
- Price Chopper Plaza was purchased, by Menands Realty, LLC. While we continue to push
 for a grocery store, it is still unclear what the plans are for the property.
- On behalf of the Village Board, Trustee Nicoll and I are teaming up with Albany County Legislator, Alison Lane, Albany County Executive, Dan McCoy, Assemblyman, Phil Steck, and others to pool our resources in exploring options to bring a grocery store back to Menands.
- There is interest in the former **Tomra Site** but no movement yet.

- 315 Broadway was owned by the Albany County Land Bank and sold to Nick DiBiase and Larry Henderson. They are remodeling the property, as they did to the house next door at 311 Broadway. We are grateful to Nick and Larry for investing in Menands.
- Poppy's Place, located at 327 Broadway was recently sold by owners Nick and Deb
 DiBiase, who retired. Under the new name of Kris' Mid City Tavern, the pub is expected to
 open St. Patrick's weekend. We wish Deb a healthy and happy retirement and best of luck to
 Kristine on her new venture as business owner in Menands.
- 228 Broadway, (former car wash) was sold and is being converted to a mixed use of retail and residential.

Beautification:

- Village Gardener, Dianne MacFarland, along with DPW Foreman, Mike Hagmann and his crew, planted and maintained the flower beds and hanging pots around the Village.
- With donations from Michelle and Frank Esposito, Dianne and the DPW created a beautiful fall display on the island.
- **Dianne** filled the stone pots with holiday greens and ribbons, completing **140 hours** of gardening in the **2018 growing seasons**.
- With help from the DPW, the gazebo was decorated for all four seasons.

Historian:

• Village Historian, Kevin Franklin, continues to amaze me with his unlimited knowledge of the Town and Village, the documents he has (which continue to expand with things donated to Kevin and his ongoing documentation of current events) and his willingness to share all that he knows to anyone interested.

Youth:

- The 2018 Summer Park Program offered fun events at the park and exciting trips including; Clifton Park Ice Skating, Sky Zone and Huck Finn Playland, Bronx Zoo, Colonie Town Pool, Wonderworks Movie and Billy Beez Zoom Flume.
- **Director Brianna Coughlin** and her counselors hosted the annual **Easter** and **Halloween** parties.
- A tree lighting ceremony, with caroling and refreshments, was held at the Menands Park, and was coordinated with the CP Rail Holiday Train passing through Menands. Brianna and I are working with CP Rail for the train to stop in Menands, instead of just passing through in 2019.
- The Ski and Snowboard Club was continued.
- CYO Basketball had another successful season.
- Menands Youth Sports hosted a fundraiser to support Village sports organizations.
- Following a down year for Menands Jr. Baseball, Softball and T-ball League in 2017, Steve Boulet and I organized a meeting to try and renew interest in the league. With many new families in the Village and people willing to step up, the league was resurrected in the spring of 2018. President Paul Nylin, the league Board, coaches and volunteers did an awesome job with the league and look forward to its continued growth and success in 2019 and beyond.
